Colossians 3:23 (NIV) –

Proverbs 18:15 –

Jesus quoted Scripture constantly — even in the desert, being tempted. He had it memorized, internalized, and ready for battle.

Colossians 3:23 –

Galatians 1:10 – “Am I now trying to win the approval of human beings, or of God?”
