Bible 101 Study: Luke Chapter 6

"The Upside-Down Kingdom"

"God, thank You for giving me Your Word. As we read Luke 6 today, help me to really listen. Not just with my ears, but with my heart. Show me what You want me to learn, and give me the courage to live it out. In Jesus' name, Amen."

Read Luke Chapter 6 (any version is fine, but NIV or ESV is great for clarity). Take your time. This chapter is loaded. Read it once all the way through, and then go back section by section for the guided study and reflection below

1. The Sabbath (vv. 1–11)

Jesus is Lord over rules – people matter more than just following religious routines.
Teen Tie-In: Picture a coach who benches the star player for wearing mismatched socks.
Jesus says: rules should serve people, not crush them.
Cross References: Matthew 12:1–14, Micah 6:6–8

2. Jesus Chooses the 12 (vv. 12-16)

Jesus handpicks 12 guys—flawed, ordinary, unexpected.

Teen Tie-In: It's like drafting your dodgeball team from kids nobody picks—Jesus sees something deeper.

S Cross References: 1 Samuel 16:7, Acts 4:13

3. Blessings and Woes (vv. 17-26)

Jesus flips the script: the poor, hungry, and hated are blessed in God's kingdom.

Teen Tie-In: Imagine getting clowned at school for doing the right thing—and Jesus saying,

"That's winning in My book."

Ø	Cross	References:	Matthew	5:1–12,	James	1:9–12
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4. Love Your Enemies (vv. 27–36)

Jesus tells us to love not just our friends, but the ones who treat us badly.
Teen Tie-In: Think of that person who treated you bad. Jesus says, pray for them, bless them, shock them with kindness.
Cross References: Romans 12:14–21, Proverbs 25:21–22

5. Don't Be a Hypocrite (vv. 37-42)

I You can't fix someone else's flaws while ignoring your own.

Teen Tie-In: Like roasting someone's bad breath while you forget to brush yours sometimes. *Cross References:* Matthew 7:1–5, Galatians 6:1–2

6. Fruit and Foundations (vv. 43–49)

What's inside you will show up outside. And building on Jesus? That's how you last through the storms.

Teen Tie-In: It's like building your life playlist on real bass vs cheap Bluetooth. One holds up,

one cuts out when things get loud.

S Cross References: James 1:22, Psalm 1
